The MAPP-K project aims to improve competences, develop innovative working practises and reinforce the motivation of adult guidance professionals and trainers.

The project's overall aim is to help tackle problems associated with Europe's ageing population.

The MAPP-K partnership, which brings together training experts within the field of mobility from across Europe, will create innovative practises, working with guidance professionals to deliver more efficient services for insertion and re-insertion in the labour market and help boost employment prospects.



OBJECTIVES:

Guidance professionals will gain and develop skills needed to deliver one-to-one and group activities for the unemployed/those who need to change their position in the labour market.

Community of Practise: giving European adult training and guidance professionals access to the best practises and rules developed in the other European countries involved in the project.

IMPACT

Improved careers guidance services (training, guidance, insertion and re-insertion to the labour market) and therefore improved employment prospects for the unemployed.

Better qualified guidance professionals: beneficiaries will develop linguistic, relational, social skills and cultural awareness.

A Virtual Community consisting of guidance professionals at a European level as a product of the Community of Practise: exchanges will allow professionals to experience new methods, feel less isolated and more motivated.

INTER-ORGANISATIONAL TRAINING

On both a regional and local level the project will contribute to improving trainers' and guidance professionals' attitudes towards moving around Europe to share and exchange best practises.

TARGET GROUP
